

Steps for the I-20 Application Process

Change of Status

Requesting an I-20 Form:

META Language School USA is authorized by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) to issue the Form I-20 for those students who would like to apply for a Student Visa to study in the USA. To qualify for a Student Visa, students must be enrolled in a full-time course (18 hours per week) of studies and/or must be traveling to the US for the sole purpose of studying. You must inform us of your interest in applying for the Student Visa (F-1) on your application form.

META will issue you the Form I-20 after receiving your complete application package with all the necessary information and following documents to request your Form I-20. Please note that Forms I-20 can only be issued after you have been accepted and enrolled to META.

Information and documents needed from the student to issue an I-20:

1. Completed application with student's signature
2. Financial Proof: We must receive a copy (can be an email):
 - a. A letter from the bank stating that the student has enough funds to pay for their program as well as their living expenses.
or
 - b. Bank statement (You should have in the bank a minimum of \$1,000 per month and \$500 a month more for each dependent) for living expenses plus \$2,500 for 6 months tuition.
 - c. If the account is not under the name of the student, the sponsorship letter form needs to be filled out by the sponsor.

3. Copy of your passport and any dependents

4. Copy of I-94

5. Initial Payment

STEP 1

- Student makes an appointment with META to start process.
- Student brings all requested paperwork.
- Student takes placement test.
- Student pays application fees.

STEP 2

- META process application and issues I-20.
- Note: META recommends consulting with an immigration lawyer to submit paperwork to avoid any errors that could lead to the denial of the application.

STEP 3

- Immigration will notify the student and/or the school of their decision.
